Hollywood Star kidnapped in Berlin!

Berlin — Dramatic scenes in the center of the capital city!

Don't panic — it's just a show. "Notting Hill" star Rhys Ifans (48) was in front of the camera there on Monday with colleague Richard Armitage (44) for the new U.S. series, "Berlin Station."

The two actors were walking along Bleibtreu Street (between Kant and Pestalozzi streets in the Charlottenburg district). Suddenly three men in black jumped out of a VW and pulled their weapons. Sacks over their heads and into the car!

The kidnapping scene was shot from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Repeated over and over again. Serial kidnapping!

That's what "Berlin Station" is about. CIA-Officer Daniel Miller (Richard Armitage) is transferred to Berlin to unmask a whistleblower. He is supported by his old friend Hector DeJean (Rhys Ifans).

But against real crooks, sometimes no one can do anything with a partner ...

They'll be shooting in and around Berlin until April. The 10 part series will be shown in the fall in the USA. In further roles are inter alia Richard Jenkins (68, "Six Feet Under") and Michelle Forbes (51, "Hunger Games").
